the Great Andamanese only. While complaining Mrs Surmai wanted that the office of ES, AAJVS should scold him and recover the goods and had no idea that her complaint shall be forwarded to the Ploice.

This is a classic case of how the Primitive Tribes are being taken care of by the different wings of the Administration. Earlier cases of some Jarawa boys and girls were also brought to the notice of Higher Ups where these unfortunate people were made witnesses. One girl is a rape victim also and the case is pending since last three four years.

The case of Sh Joe is also pending in the court of CGM Port Blair as per the information given by Sh Joe.

At this stage it is proposed that we may atleast ensure that Sh Joe gets his monthly subsistence allowance in time which he has not got since last so many months and that we should make a case to withdraw the theft case from the court of the CGM. We are well aware that the Great Andamanese are at the verge of its extinction and we should make all out efforts to give them conditions for their growth and avoid such incidents and if at all such cases of petty theft etc come up the same could be solved out of court itself.

Since AAJVS headed by the Hon'ble Lt. Governor it is proposed that the fact of the case may also be brought to his notice for perusal and further orders and / or guidance to be followed in future by the junior functionaries.
