When this matter is moved by the learned advocate for the petitioner, the learned advocate for the respondent Nos.1-3 raises an objection with regard to the maintainability of the present writ petition. He also submits that an opportunity should be granted to the said respondents to file affidavit-in-opposition. The learned advocate for the respondent Nos.4-7 also submits that the said respondents would like to file affidavit-in-opposition.

Having heard the learned advocates for the respective parties let the respective affidavits-in-opposition be filed within four weeks from this date. Reply, if any, may be filed within one week thereafter.

Let this matter come up 'for hearing' after five weeks before the appropriate Circuit Bench.

There shall be an interim order of stay of operation of the notice dated 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2010 being annexure P-13 to the writ petition for a period of seven weeks or until further order whichever is earlier.

It is made clear that the respondents will be entitled to raise the question of maintainability of the writ petition at the time of hearing of the petition.

Let a plain copy of this order duly countersigned by the Assistant Registrar (Court) be given to the parties on usual undertakings.
