

STATEMENT OF IMPUTATION OF MISCONDUCT OR MISBEHAVIOUR IN  
SUPPORT OF THE ARTICLES OF CHARGE FRAMED AGAINST SHRI GOVIND  
RAM, ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER(TW)/EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, AAJVS,  
PORT BLAIR.

ARTICLE - I

On 7/10/2008 in the afternoon at about 2 PM, Shri Govind Ram while functioning as Assistant Commissioner (TW)/Executive Secretary, AAJVS under A&N Admn., during his duty hours went to the residential quarter No.174/3 at Minnie Bay of Smti MV Jayalakshmi, W/o Shri R Vasantha Kumar, R/c Minnie Bay and finding her alone in her residence misbehaved with her and after confining molested her with the intention to tarnish the image and modesty of a woman. In her complaint registered as FIR 835/08 dated 7/10/2008 at PS Aberdeen, Smti MV Jayalakshmi stated that said Shri Govind Ram, on entering her residence, closed the main entrance door, removed his shirt, pulled and held her in his arms and molested her. Thereafter, Smti MV Jayalakshmi, got herself free from the clutches of said Shri Govind Ram, by force and after opening the door came out of the house and called her driver Shri Salim, crying for help. On hearing her cry for help, Shri Salim, driver and her neighbour came on the spot and caught hold of Shri Govind Ram and made him to sit there. Subsequently, Smti MV Jayalakshmi telephoned to Naval Police and there being no response, she telephoned Police Control Room and the Police team arrived in a Jeep at about 2.45 PM and took Shri Govind Ram in custody. As per intimation received from the SP(District) vide his letter No.SP(D)/A/2008/8488 dated 8/10/2008, on her complaint, a case FIR No.835/08 dated 7/10/2008 U/S 342/354 IPC at PS Aberdeen was registered and Shri Govind Ram, Assistant Commissioner (TW)/Executive Secretary, AAJVS was arrested on 7/10/2008 at 1810 hrs and was subsequently released on bail on the same day at 2150 hrs.

Shri Govind Ram, by his above acts, behaved in a manner unbecoming of a Govt. servant and violated the provisions of Rule 3 (1) (ii) & (iii) of Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964.
