Refer to para 88/N. What is the tenure of In-charge, Police Radio Centre, Strait Island? It appears that the tenure is very short. If that is the case, will it be convenient to assign the task of handling the case to the person from Police Radio? Further will it not lead to blocking of the funds. If the entire amount is drawn for the year and given over to the in-charge Police Radio Centre? Further, does the Police Radio Centre have the minimum infrastructure for the safety of liquid cash?

There has to be Social Worker or a person from AAJVS as an In-charge of the Andamanese Settlement at Strait Island. Presently Social Worker, Headquarters is holding additional the charge of Social Worker; matters relating to posting of In-charge Strait Island is under the consideration of Secretary (TW). Once the decision is taken in this regard there should not be any problem in this context.

Why is it not possible to draw the cash allowances of Andamanese on the same day as it is done in connection with the salary of the employee of the AAJVS, that is, on last working day of the month? If that is done, cash can be disbursed to the Andamanese in the first week of the following month itself.

Refer to the note at para 89/N above. Who maintains the attendance and who supervises the Muster Roll work in the field and who prepares the Muster Roll? Who shall disburse the wages? Can the In-charge, Police Radio Centre do all theses tasks relating to supervising the work in the field maintaining the Muster Roll and disbursement of wages?

Alternatively, the effective course of action could be as follows:

(i) In-charge-Andamanese Settlement shall send the number of mandays by signal on the last working day of the month on the basis of the muster roll attendance maintained regularly. 91
