197	<p>During a meeting held on 1.6.2012 at Raj Niwas under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble LG convened while reviewing the preparedness of the Administration in implementation of PAT Amendment Regulations it was resolved that AAJVS volunteers have to be properly briefed who would in turn tactfully advice Jarawa not to interact with non tribal, settlers, tourists and other passengers using ATR. Jarawas may be educated not to board the vehicles plying in ATR.
