	<p>The Jarawa children demanded chappal/shoes which was a new demand never heard before.</p> <p><u>Recommendations:-</u></p> <p>a) Steps may be taken to impart training to Pharmacist and ANMs of Andaman Adim Janjati Vikas Samiti to administer necessary treatment for snake bites. Anti-dote injections may be stored with AAJVS. AAJVS may procure small refrigerators to store vital medicines and drugs at Tirur, Jirkatang, Middle Strait, Kadamtala and other places.</p> <p>b) In order to monitor the presence of AAJVS staff at the place of duty, an Officer from the Department may be sent every week on the Andaman Trunk Road, especially at odd hours without any intimation.</p> <p>c) All the school going Jarawa children at Tirur, Potatang, Lakra Lungta and Phooltala may be provided an additional set of uniform immediately.</p> <p>d) Jarawas may be provided with iron tools like spade, dah, triangular file, chisel etc so as to prepare arrows for hunting / fishing</p> <p>e) Secretary (Ind) may be provided with a write up on Taigaey and Uhhu including photographs for commercial marketing of the products at various prominent places.</p> <p>f) Tribal Welfare Officers may identify more locations for raising plantations like jack fruit, papaya etc to augment their food resources. Tribal Welfare Officer shall submit a report on progress of plantations already raised including area, no. of plants raised, no.of plants surviving, tree guards etc without delay and fail.</p> <p>g) The community centre at Phooltala may be repaired immediately.</p> <p>h) AAJVS may request the District Administration to allot 1000 sq. Mtrs of land at Phooltala and Jirkatang for creation of infrastructure</p> <p>i) One ANM each at Jirkatang and Kadamtala were found absent from duty. Similarly during tour to Tirur, an ANM was found absent from duty. Tribal Welfare Officer of the area concern may be asked to submit a report accordingly.</p>
