

- 1. Possible two day sequence of meeting could be considered starting from the July 8th 2013.
- 2. The major focus could be on two agendas. One, starting the Research Institute and second, creating a systematic structure whereby the implementation of the policy of welfare emerging from research is not lost between mere shuffling of files and changing person in the office. This has to be taken up on the lines of a "mission".
- 3. There are some important aspects that need to be followed up in each of the reserve areas and specific tribal group that need to be undertaken as priority and kept distinct from the day to day operations. These are steps and procedures that grow out of the research conducted in relation to policy implementation that have to be activated to make the difference. These tasks are separate from the nature of making sure just the continuity of daily tasks.
- 4. About the Research Institute, the participants could make a brief presentation and we have a brain storming and come up with concrete steps to take and get it going. (Individuals from Expert group and Administration would be prime area to consider)
- 5. The Research Institute could be started with a small group that meets every month or so, and makes sure that a minimum of two staff team starts the various work on priority and time frame basis.
- 6. For both the "Mission" and Research Institute- the administration could appoint a honorary position for a year who makes sure that the work moves in right direction and the office of AAJVS and particularly its staff is accountable. A senior administrator above the honorary position would be directly accountable to and will be constant direct communication.
- The yearlong honorary position holder may not be essentially stationed in Port Blair but be frequently available and visit the work site and meet with team and co-workers and over see the progress.
- 8. At the proposed meeting we should also plan out what we need to do and how and why as far as Sentinelese are concerned.
- 9. If possible at the end of the dedicated sessions as outlined above- a study trip to Dugong Creek should be undertaken.
