NUTES OF THE MEETING ON RELIEF MEASURES HELD AT WAS UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF LG AT 7.30 AM ON JAN, 05 INCONNECTION WITH DEVASTATING EARTHQUAKE SUNAMI ON 26.12.2004

At was decided that ration items for affected Islands who are either staying in camps or taking food from community kitchen may be given ration, free of cost, as per the following norms, and accordingly it should be arranged/distributed to all affected area through relief camps or community kitchens till the normalcy returns. The procurement shall be made through Civil Supplies/ANIIDCO/ CSS/ ANCOFED.

We may also supply two pairs of clothes and undergarments to all affected people alongwith required number of washing/bathing soap, bed sheets, tarpaulin etc.

For any additional item, if required, Deputy Commissioner(A) and Deputy Commissioner(N) may provide the same directly or may send requirement to Relief Commissioner.

It was informed that because of emergency situation, certain ration/ food articles etc were purchased from available sources and supplied on war footing to avoid starvation death and mitigate their miseries.

Relief Camps:

It was informed that the NGOs running the relief camps in Port Blair are also demanding food articles for the affected people. Since, their services are still required for providing space, manpower and/or management of relief camp, therefore, ration items shall be provided by Deputy Commissioner(A) to NGO's by assessing the requirement by the DC(A) for camps run by NGO's in Port Blair.

It was also decided that

- Relief camp shelter should not be put in low lying areas.

- Only new cloths should be given to evacuees/ affected people.
