

Bhathubasthi for the last two days. Dr Madhukrishna informed that he will check up the matter. Dr Madhukrishna further informed the meeting that his organization is ready to look after atleast 2500 people for three months without taking any help from the government. He also informed that his organization will help the affected people staying in the Relief Camps to have some livelihood.

All the representatives of the Voluntary Organisations have stated that the ration articles now being supplied by the Administration does not include anything for breakfast and they are making their own arrangements for supply of breakfast to the inmates staying in their respective Relief Camps.

Representatives of Vol. Organisations from the Relief Camp at Govt. Boys' Sr. Sec. School stated that the Principal of the school, who is keeping the ration items for the said Camp, is not issuing sufficient materials for cooking food.

Rajasthan Manch, whose volunteers are cooking food in the Relief Camp at Govt. Sr. Secondary School, Haddo (Telugu), reported that there exists some unpleasant situation in the Camp due to the non-cooperation of the inmates there. Representatives of the Rajasthan Manch further stated that certain elements among the inmates are trying to create problems in the Camp. The inmates have voluntarily said that they would cook the food. For one or two days they prepared the food and on one day all of a sudden they stopped cooking, citing some reasons. The representatives of the Manch have stated that the Principal had ordered closure of the gate in the evening of 16<sup>th</sup> January, 2005 to prevent people from going out. This has infuriated the inmates who in the next morning started some kind of agitation. The Director of Social Welfare informed that the matter was brought to his notice and efforts were made to sort out the problem. He further stated that he is again going to the said Centre immediately after the meeting.

Representative from Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram informed that about 80 Defence personnel are staying there and wanted them to be shifted to some other Camps. The Director of Social Welfare advised the representative of the Vanvaki Ashram to take up the matter with the Deputy Commissioner.

Representatives from Rajasthan Manch demanded that some more vegetables like gopi, lobia, kumda, hara mich, etc. should be supplied to the Relief Camps. Representatives from other voluntary organizations had also demanded the same. Rajasthan Manch representatives stated that they are spending approximately Rs. 3000 per day in the Relief Camp. 4 - 5 people are exclusively engaged for the Relief Camps.
