In the light of the above paras, it is submitted that out of 50 Great Andamanese, 13 are in service and almost one in each family is in service. Therefore, supply of these items seems not to be justified in normal circumstances. But since, their belongings at Strait Island has been totally washed out due to the tsunami waves, we may have to provide them with all their requirements till they are again rehabilitated or settled as they are Primitive Tribes and also victims of the disastrous tidal waves.

The anticipated expenditure of the above purchases would be approximately Rs.15,000/- and these items are not be provided by the Administration under Disaster management scheme. Therefore, AAJVS may have to bear the cost of the above items.
