So, the need of the moment is to provide a system by which the demands of Jarawas are met in such a way that they are not vulnerable to exploitation:-

- They have to be empowered to understand the monetary value of goods they barter
- A system has to be set up at the hotspots by which AAJVS can supply goods to them (this can be decided in a phased manner to be discussed with the Jarawas)
- A discussion on the modalities for the above has to be organized urgently in the hotspots
- A plantation of indigenous plants of fruits which are being used by the Jarawas may be raised in consultation with the Jarawas near their habitats

In addition, certain regulatory measures can help enforcement of laws

- Police, Forest and AAJVS would purchase and place engine dinghy / Gemini boat one each and deploy in Tirur area
- The Jarawa Protection Post (JPP) No: 4 may be provided with a binocular for keeping vigil / watch on illegal activities in Jarawa area.
- A register to be maintained at JPP No: 4 to record details of any boat / dinghy crossing JPP NO: 4
- These solutions which have been given by Prof Pandya and Director (TW) after their visit to Tirur would be discussed with Director General of Police and Forest department.
