Candidates during elections campaigned for a liberal tourism policy,relaxing buffer zones, expanding the ATR and bringing Jarawas into 'mainstream'(education, health, food doles- what some may call undignified dependence). Is this a battle of resources between the settler population where unemployment is high and the tribals who preserved the last patch of tropical rainforests in the Islands?</p>	<p>This is bit of drawing attention and sympathy gaining by political parties to their own advantage. We have no plans of pushing Jarawas into preconceived idea of what is "main stream". Giving doles has been curtailed, we are working on creating distinct and appropriate educational programme.</p> <p>The Tribal Welfare Department of the Administration including the ANTRI has taken up programme for sensitization of the settlers of the surroundings villages namely Collinpur, Herbatabad, Manpur, Templemyo and Tirur being sensitive in view of the frequent interactions and poaching by the settlers in the Jarawa Reserve Area over the years.</p> <p>Over a period of 06 months, so far four sensitization programme have been held involving settlers and PRI representatives. Further, a few individuals from the settlers community have been engaged as volunteers/ informers by AAJVS to keep watch on intrusions/ poaching by the settlers including movement of the Jarawas into the adjoining settlement villages and report to the Tribal Welfare Officer posted at Tirur whenever such incidents takes place. The outcome of such initiatives has been very positive/ encouraging in view of the fact that a few habitual offenders of the area could be apprehended/ nabbed and brought to book. The recent apprehension of 07 poachers on 18.1.2014 was one among them. The impact of sensitization of the settlers of the adjoining villages of the Jarawas reserve coupled with strict enforcement of the law is now visible/ felt as the incidents of poaching and other</p>
