In order to further tighten the implementation of the Jarawa Policy in letter and spirit it has been felt necessary to declare the existing belt of 30 meters on each side of the ATR from Jirkatang to Middle Strait as reserved area, and also to make it necessary for the persons other than pre 1942 settlers and their descendents, settlers and their dependent family members who have been rehabilitated/settled in these islands under the approved scheme of the Government, and permanent inhabitants among the people of South, Middle & North Andaman Islands as defined under Rule 170 of the A & N Islands Land Revenue and Land Reform Rules 1968 all of whom have valid Islanders Identity Card issued by the A&N Administration, to obtain a tribal pass under the above said regulation for entering the Jarawa territory and the buffer zone arround it. This proposal was circulated amongst the Forest Department, Police Department, District Administration, IP&T Department and the AAJVS and their observations are summarised below:
