- 3. Secretary (TW) also took a decision to engage two youths from each village who will inform the police and AAJVS staff about the Jarawa movement and help the staff in handling the Jarawa situation. The concerned Panchyat will select the youths and send the list to AAJVS. These youths will be given orientation course by the Tribal Welfare Department and Anthropological Survey of India and they will be paid with some honorarium.
- 4. The Member of Parliament stated that monthly Rs. 75.00 lakhs being spent and out of which Rs. 35.00 is being spent pay and allowance to the staff of Jarawas and the Jarawas are benefited very little. In this connection it is to state that the AAJVS has kept a provision of Rs. 13.05 lakhs for the welfare of the Jarawas for the year 2000-2001 and till 31.08.2000 Rs. 15.22 lakhs has been spent. The expenditure includes providing of gifts, hospitalisation, hire charges of Jeep and engine dinghy, maintenance of motor cycle pay & allowance of staff etc.
- 5. The Member of Parliament suggested to convene a meeting to invite suggestions from public to check the incoming of the Jarawas in the villages. If approved, a meeting can be convened with the Member of Parliament, Pradhan of Kadamtala, Uttara, Baratang, Tushnabad and with Task Force Committee members and discuss the issues with them.
