2. To prevent entry of Jarawas:

The Secretary (TW) took a decision that, in the vulnerable areas from where the Jarawas frequently enters into the villages will be posted with additional police force provided, the villagers construct structures in such areas and once the structure is constructed and handed over to the police, additional police staff will be posted who will prevent the entry of Jarawas to the villages. The villager has agreed for the construction of the structures.

3. Distribution of ration etc. to the Jarawas:

The Secretary (TW) also took a decision to engage two youths from each village who will inform police and AAJVS staff about the Jarawa movement and help the staff in handling the Jarawa situation. The concerned Panchayat will select the youths and send the list to AAJVS. These youths will be given orientation course by the Tribal Welfare Department and Anthropological Survey of India and they will be paid with some honorarium.

spent and out of which Rs. 35.00 lakh is being spent pay and allowancested the staff of Jarawas and the Jarawas are benefited very little. In this connection, it is to state that the AAJVS has kept a provision of Rs. 13.05 lakh for the welfare of the Jarawas for the year 2000-2001 and till 31/08/2000 Rs. 15.22 lakh has been spent. The expenditure include providing of gifts, hospitalization, hire charge of the jeep and engine dinghy, maintenance of motor cycle, pay & allowances staff etc.
