I am to refer to your letter number 12016 | 17 | 81-SCD(R.Cell), A&N Islands dated 8.4.94 regarding the above mentioned subject.

The Administration had carried out Socioeconomic survey of Ranchi communities of Bihar and
Karens to collect their ethnographic details
including the population, background history etc. at
the instance of the Govt. of India vide their letter
number 12016 17 81-SC & BCD-IV I(R Cell) dated
8.5.91.

In this context it may be pointed out that initially the Ranchis from Bihar have been settled in these Islands under the rehabilitation scheme of the Covt, of India. Later on, a sizeable population of the Ranchis have migrated from their State of origin, i.e. Bihar on their own and settled in these Islands. As regards, Karens, they were initially brought to these Islands by the erstwhile British Administration of India in 1925-26 to work as labourers in the Forest Department and subsequently settled in these Islands. Thus, both Ranchis and Karens are originally migrant communities and they are not original inhabitants of these Islands unlike the aboriginal tribes of these Islands. As per the wisting instructions of the Govt, of India, local addents of these Islands including Ranchis and Karens are given preserence for appointment to/groupCandD postingy are also eligible for allotment of seats in various professional courses in the educational institutions in the mainland.
