BRIEF HISTORY OF THE KAREN TRIBE IN ANDAMAN & NICOBAR ISLANDS

That, Karen is a tribe of Mongoloid origin. They were brought down to Andamans from Burma now Myanmar (a very part and parcel of British India) in April 1925 by the then British Govt. of India. Initially a batch of 12 families came under the leadership of Rev. Lugyi and Thra Sanba. The second batch of 50 families came down in 1926. They were engaged in forest works which was found laborious, dangerous and capacitate in deep forest timber extraction and plantation. They also handled elephants of the Forest Department. Some have worked in Chatham Saw Mill and few were engaged in leveling the Gymkhana Ground at Port Blair.

As the years passed by, the tempo of the Forest work had slowed down and some Karen started going back to Burma .By 1937 a large number had gone back. In 1967 more went back and those who stayed back have opted for Indian Citizenship. Subsequently the Karen were given land at Webi and nearby areas in Middle Andaman for cultivation and to start their own settlement .The 1951 census shows that there were 384 Karen and were considered naturalized Indians by the Andaman& Nicobar Administration and the Govt.of India. After that no separate census for the Karen community was taken. Today, the Karen settlement spread out in eight villages. Total Karen population is about 2200.

That, Karen are peace loving, honest and hard working people. They have lived all these years peacefully with very few demands. Cultivation of paddy is the main occupation
