 - Need for setting up of a Marine Police Force (MPF)
- 5.44669 MHA had sanctioned posts and other infrastructure for strengthening of the MPF of the A&N Administration to check poaching effectively However, a similar proposal for setting up of a full-fledged MPF in Lakshadweep has got stuck in view of the blanker ban on creation of posts by the Finance Ministry, as part of austerity measures. It was informed by the representative of Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) that an Indian Reserve Battalion (IRB) has been sanctioned, in the meanwhile, for Lakshadweep, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu. This will provide about 500 personnel in Lakshadweep who can anti-poaching activities. appropriately for Lakshadweep emphasized that to control poaching a specialised force with necessary equipment is required and IRB may not be enough, in view of high tech poaching which is going on. Chairman, while agreeing that it is necessary to have a specialised force like MPF. suggested that a beginning could be made by utilising IRB, till the time ban on creation of posts is lifted.
