Recognisation of the Nicobare Tribal Couns No.2 Nicobarese settlers at Hut Bay(Little Andaman Wigh are discussed as under:-

No.1 Recongnistion of Nicobare Tribal Council



A copy of draft Tribal Council Regulation from Nicobars formulated by this Administration was sent to the Dy.Commissionr, Nicobars with the request to obtain the views of the Tribal people. As per the report of the DC, Nicobar, thr Tribal epeople have not yet firmed up with their views on the draft regulations. Which may be perused at second para of the letter dt.21/10/97 at page/30/commission. Sri Ibrahim Ali Hussain, the Tribal councils in the Nicobar Dist. have been working wonderfully to keep the people safe at and intact with their Tribal culture and traditions except for the outside interference which need to be diride checked.



In view of the above suggestions put forward by Sri Ibrahim Ali Hussain, there starts to be no need to set up a Tribal Council in the Nicobar Dist.

No.2: Nicobarese Settler at Hut Bay (Little Andas)



Initially 50 Nicobare families from Car Nicobar were brought from to Little Andamns and settled at Harmander Bay in an area of 500 acrs of land relesed by the Govt. of India . With the passage of time 125 Nicobar families from Car Nicobar moved volunterly to the Little Andamans and settled with the 50 Nicobarese families already settled here . Thus the no of
