Promulgated by the President in the Forty ninth year of the Republic of India.

A Regulation further to amend the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) Regulation, 1956.

In exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 240 of the Constitution, the President is pleased to promulgate the following regulation made by him:

- Short title 1 (i) and commencement
- This Regulation may be called the Andaman and Nicobar Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) (Amendment) Regulation, 2002.
- (ii) It shall come into force on such date as the Lieutenant Governor may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.
- Amendment 2 of Section 8

- In Principal Regulation instead of the existing provisions under the Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) of Section 8, the following shall be substituted:-
- (1) Whoever, in contravention of the provisions of Section 6, acquires any interest in or in any product of, or crop raised on, any land, or carries on any trade or business, in a reserved area shall be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to one year and a minimum fine of Rs. 2000/- extendable upto Rs. 10,000/- and the interest so acquired shall be disposed of in such manner as the Lieutenant Governor may, after taking into consideration the circumstances of the case, direct.
 - (2) Whoever, in contravention of a Notification issued under Section 7, enters a reserved area shall be punishable with imprisonment, which may extend to one year and a minimum fine of Rs. 2000/-extendable upto Rs. 10,000/-.
 - (3) Whoever, does anything in contravention of any of the conditions or restrictions subject to which a pass has been granted to him under Section 7, shall be punishable with imprisonment which may extend to one year and a minimum fine of Rs. 2000/- extendable upto Rs. 10,000/-
