Kindly refer to your D.O letter No. U-11023/7/99-UTL dated 21/07/2004 regarding promulgation of Regulation for amendment of Section - A of the A&N Islands (PAT) Regulation, 1956. The information on the points raised in your letter is furnished as under: -

a) The number of persons who have been charge sheeted and prosecuted under the aforesaid Regulation during the last 15 years and how many cases ended with acquittal;

A total of 2026 persons were charge sheeted, out of which 1812 persons were convicted and one person acquitted during the last 15 years, i.e., from 1989 to 2003.

b) Whether there is an increase in the number of such cases over the past 15 years; &

The number of cases registered year-wise under the A&N Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) Regulation 1956 are given below:
