Referring back to the recommendation of the Working Group vide page 6/c, the Ministry of Home Affairs have now desired the Administration to specify the reasons for dropping the minimum fine of Rs. 2000/- (PUC). In this connection it is pointed out that the Ministry of Home Affairs had never objected to the minimum penalty in respect of fine. So the Ministry of Home Affairs appears to be inclined to minimum fine of Rs. 2000/- to be incorporated in the proposed amendment. Accordingly the revised amendment to Section 8 (1) (2) & (3) of the Regulation is proposed as under.

"Imprisonment which may extend to one year and a minimum fine of Rs. 2000/- extendable upto Rs. 10,000/-".

A draft notification incorporating the above amendment has been attempted & placed opposite for consideration please. The Hon'ble Lt. Governor, A & N Islands is competent to approve of the proposal.
