hutment dwellers has been raised to 90 per cent w.e.f. April 1, 1996.

As per the scheme, the following are the benefits provided in the slum areas for the hutment dwellers:

- "i) House-to-house water supply;
- ii) House-to-house drainage connection;
- iii) Full pavement of internal street;
- iv) Individual toilet;
- v) Provision of storm water drain;
- vi) _Solid waste management services;
- vii) Street light, etc.

Besides the physical services, a package of community development services is also offered which includes:

- i) Primary education;
- ii) Primary health care;
- iii) Income generating activities etc.
