house approved of the proposed method of determination of income of families/house hold and the Hon'ble MP and the House also approved of the same. The Chairman DRDA also informed that the with reference to implementation of various Rural Development revealed during the Survey would be kept strictly confidential. Whether assets owned by the families would be considered as this regard has already been sought from A&N Admn. Shri Ibrahim Ali Hussain DRDA informed that clarification in Ali Hussain opined that once the clarification is received a the survey starts. This was agreed by the Chairman DRDA.

AGENDA ITEM NO.3 Nicobar District as a difficult area for purpose of admissible assistance under Govt. of India schemes.

Chairman DRDA informed the House that under various Development schemes specially under popular Indira Awas the maximum admissible assistance to poor beneficiaries Yojana upon whether the area is a plain area or a difficult area. Under IAY maximum admissible assistance in a plain area is Rs.20,000/- per beneficiary while it is Rs.22,000/- per beneficiary in difficult areas. Hon ble MP elaborated various problems faced by the islands of Nicobar District viz: remote insufficient logistics specially Shipping Services, lack of infrastructure and man power and wide spread poverty. opined that entire A&N islands in itself is a difficult area therefore Nicobar District should definitely be considered, and declared as difficult area for purpose of admissible assistance under various Rural Development Schemes of Govt. of India. The entire house agreed with the recommenations of Hon'ble MP and was decided that the decision of GBM in this irespect communicated to concerned authorities. 11 Will

AGENDA ITEM NO.4 Administrative expenses/Departmental Charges

The Chairman DRDA informed to the house that under the scheme Minimum Needs Programme (MNP) of Union Territory of Andaman and Nicobar Islands there is a provision for assistance basis to the tribals and 50% subsidy basis to the non tribals. He further stated that DRDA Nicobars has so far made impressive benefitted from this scheme and most of the beneficiaries who have that since the inception of the scheme about 3500 PFLs have been year itself.

He further informed that in other Rural Development schemes of Govt, of India there has been a provisions of administrative expenditure for successful implementation of schemes. Under IRDP 15% under JRY, IAY & MWS 2% each and under
