Advisory Committee on Primitive Tribal
Groups of A & N Islands held on 15/7/86
at Raj Niwas, Port Blair.

Sir,

Kindly refer to your letter No. 1-421/84-TW
dated the 10th Feb., '87 on the subject cited above.
In this connection I am to state that the information
called for therein in the letter under reference is
furnished as under:-

Jarawa contact party is being thoroughly
examined by medical officer before they visit to
the Jarawa areas.

2. Contact party is staying in the Jarawa area
from morning to afternoon.

3. Officers of the Anthropological Survey of India
Port Blair have volunteered many a time to stay at night
with Jarawas at Chota-lig Bay. It seems, no decision
has been taken so far in this regard.

4. Bush Police personnel have been directed not
to take any punitive action against Jarawas. It is
being complied with.

5. Refresher course of Bush Police personnel is
being held regularly at Police Lines, Port Blair and they
are being imparted training about the protection of
Jarawas and their interests. Bush Police personnel
are conscious about their duties. Senior officers
of Police during their visits to Bush Police camps
also properly brief the Bush Police personnel in this
regard to deal with this primitive tribe.
