Of the six scheduled tribes in these Islands, the Jarawas and Sentineltse are nomadic and the shompens are semi_nomadic. The Jarawas & sentinelese not only nomadic but also hostile to outsiders. The Administration has constituted official contact teams which go to the Jarawas once in a month and to the Sentinelese once in two months to establish contact/order to befriend them & bring into main_stream of civilization. The Jarawas have become frindly to the contact team & shed themr hostility to a great extent in recent years, while our contact with the Sentimelese is very minimal. It will not be possible to take up any comprehensive development programmes for these two tribal groups unless we have won their confidence & established full

The Shompens are semi-nomedic. They charge their habitats when food resources are exhausted. A scheme is being the gund implementated from SCA under TSP to develop plantations of coconuts & other fruits to augment their food resources at the shompen habitates so that they do not change their habitats in search of food resources.
