I am directed to reproduce below an extract from the report of the commuttee of Anthropologist on the Jarawa and the Shompan sctuation constituted by the Govt. of India %

It appear that a part of the cause for confrontation between Jarawa and the nen-tribals lies in exploitation of forests. It is no secret that whereaver local felling occurs , unauthorised removal of timber takes place . Even, wanthanisms ordinarily, a tribe resents exploitation of forests in the area which it regards its own , though the preception of the ferest department may be different . The situation etc exacerbated when intruders resett to illegal entry into the Reserve. This reason has been ascribed unefficially tos some incident-s by the people whom we met Out view is that exploitation of the forest in the area adjoining the Jarawa Reserve in the south and middle Islands should be banned . We understood from the Chief Conservator of Forests, Andaman Administration that the total forest revenue of the Islands is of the order of Rs 5 crores though they have not been able to give us a figure for the area in question . then pressed .
