

The sign boards on the boundary of Jarwa reserve may be put up by the Forest Department.

(IV) The policy of maintaining regular contact with the Tribe should be systematically followed and regular reports sent to P.M's Office

Contact with the Jarawas is being continued, we may send report to P.M's office on future contacts when made as desired.

(V) Anthropological study of Jarawa Tribe by competent scientists.

This point may be discussed ~~with~~ in the meeting of the Advisory Committee on primitive Tribal groups when held.

An Officer concerned and sensitive enough is also to be appointed for monitoring the implementation of the safe guards recommended by the team of Anthropologists.

The contents of GOI's D.O. letter under reference has been examined at length and the comments on the points are as follows:-

i) We are not concerned with this ~~para~~.

ii) There may be no objection in declaring the area along the entire length of road on the western side falling in the Jarwa area as Jarwa Reserve. But as far as Eastern side is concerned, we will have to ascertain from the DC Andamans as to the details regarding settlement areas falling in this side. These areas have to be marked on the map and extended. Leaving apart this settlement pockets, there may not be any objection in declaration of the Eastern side too as Jarwa Reserve.
