

5. On the suggestion of the Chairman, it was decided that radio talks by Anthropologists of ASI should be organised to enlighten about the problems involved in the interaction between primitive tribes and non tribals. These talks should focus on the care to be taken by non-tribals so that primitive tribal ways of life are not adversely affected. The members of the Watch Dog Committee too should deliver radio talks on the same subject with emphasis on their respective departmental specialisations.

Press insertions should also be put in order to sensitise people to the problem.

6. Members of the Watch Dog Committee should go on a physical inspection of the Jarawa area around Andaman Trunk Road on 24th July, 1985. They should submit their reports to the Chairman of the Watch Dog Committee.

The Chief Engineer, Bander Roads or his representative should accompany the party on the 24th instant.

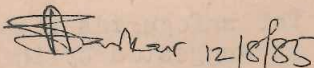
Assistant Commissioner (TW) may go with the party.

7. On the submission of the Superintendent of Police (Armed Police) that one batch (34 people) of Bush Police have been through an orientation course to familiarise themselves with the PAT Act and that another batch (34 people) is attending orientation course, the following decision was taken.

Anthropologists should be invited to deliver lectures to Bus Police personnel attending the orientation course.

The Principal Engineer, APWD, reported that earth cutting from 91 to 94 KM of A.T. Road has been done. Earth cutting for 95 to 98 KM is in progress.
