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
(28) (d) Closure of the existing camps will mean that the entire expenditure incurred on establishment of the camps, and laying of tramlines, roads etc amounting to several lakhs of rupees will become infructuous apart from the gross amount of revenue accrued annually.

(29) (e) The material i.e., Trucks, tractors, Locomotives, elephants, motor boats etc detailed for working in these areas will become surplus.

(30) Incidentally it may be mentioned that because of the strict instructions to our staff and labourers, not to intrude into the Jarawa Reserve, the occurrence of Jarawa incident in the area is bare minimum.

(31) The Forest Department fully appreciate the importance being attached to protection of the tribe and we feel that instead of simply banning forestry activities in the areas adjoining the Jarawa Reserves, we should rather concentrate more on effective maintenance of the sanctity of the Jarawa Reserve by resorting to regular patrolling and taking drastic action against the intruders, for which the Andaman Administration is having a separate Bush Police Force.
