

3. Film "Palna" (Hindi: 2 mts) is made with an objective to motivate childless couples to adopt a child through Central Adoption Resource Agency. It describes complete procedure of in-country adoption including details of how to and from where to adopt a child. The film has been made with a special element of motivation for adoption of a girl child.
4. 'PAHAL' on how to identify and rehabilitate drug addicts. (Hindi, 23).
The film revolves around the ways and means adopted by various non-governmental organizations- working with assistance from the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment - in identifying and rehabilitating drug addicts. India has an estimated three million drug users spread across the country. And the number is increasing at an alarming pace. Today, drug abuse is no more confined to a particular class or group of society nor to the traditionally abused narcotic drugs or substances like opium, cannabis and alcohol. The proliferation of synthetic drugs like heroin today is wreaking havoc in several parts of the country. This film is an attempt at checking this growing menace.
5. "Disha" (Hindi: 5 mts) aims at motivating non-Government organizations to work in the areas of deaddiction and rehabilitation of drug addicts. The film gives details of eligibility and criteria for forming an NGO and receiving grants in aid from the Government to work in this field.
6. "Dastak" (Hindi: 23 mts) is a success story of women movement against alcoholism. The film picks up true case stories from Andhra Pradesh, Haryana and Manipur and depicts success of this movement in a very powerful manner through strong documentation of facts including of activists etc.
7. "Navjeevan" (Hindi: 23 mts) shows an innovative way of drug deaddiction through yoga. The film discusses the deaddiction and prohibition policy of the Government. The Non-Government Organisations receiving grants from the Government for using yoga as an effective means of drug deaddiction has been very strongly showcased in the film.
8. 'HUM HONGE KAMYAB' on Drug Abuse Prevention. (Hindi, 23 mts)
The documentary emerges from the thought that while the problem of drug and drug abuse is no longer new to our society, the number of drug addicts are increasing day by day by leaps and bounds and is fast reaching endemic proportions. With little warning and even less reason, they succumb to the 20th century scourge-the scourge of chemical dependency. Physically wrecked, mentally empty shells and spiritually frozen, chemical dependencies not only envelops them but also devastates their families as well, shattering their peace and prestige. The film is a sincere attempt to save mankind, particularly the youth, from the menace to drugs.
8. "Dhalati Umar Ka Sapna" (Hindi: 23 mts) is about facilities being provided in old age homes run for the care of the aged, Old Age Homes, Day Care Centres and Mobile Medi Care Units run by the Government.
