This Department has, in consultation with the law officers of the Government, examined whether the above referred judgement introduces the concept of creamy layer for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. This Department has been advised that the observations made in Nagaraj's case regarding creamy layer amongst the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are mere obiter dicta, per incurium and do not flow from, and cannot be reconciled with the nine judge bench judgement of the Supreme Court in the matter of Indra Sawhney. The reference to creamy layer in the concluding paragraph and other portions of the judgement does not relate to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes.
