

a) Hotspots have been built within the Jarawa Tribal Reserve namely Jhao Kona, Tirur and Potatang in South Andaman and Phooltala, Lewis Inlet and Lakra Lungta in North & Middle Andaman District for exchange and sharing of information between the staff and AAJVS.

b) Based on the recommendations of the study report of experts, "Kangaapo" the stitched garments are being given to Jarawa women on their specific demand and on barter basis, to preserve their self respect.

c) A protocol of surveillance has been put in place to secure Western Coast of South and Middle Andaman islands, bordering Jarawa Tribal Reserve from intruders/poachers by three layers of surveillance through Joint Patrol Parties in the seaward side of the Western Coast involving Navy, Coast Guard, Police Marine force, AAJVS and Forest Departments;

d) The first phase of provisions of books of bilingual and bicultural curriculum namely "Ang Katha" for the Jarawas has been made to instill community identity vis-à-vis the "outside world".

The welfare delivery system of the ANI Administration is under constant scrutiny of both National & International NGOs, like UK based "Survival International" which advocates isolation and preservation of Jarawa tribe. However, since the Jarawa tribe is no more in isolation and the habitat is in close vicinity of the settlement village, it is the endeavour of the Administration that the Jarawa tribe is in no manner exploited by anybody. The Administration has set for itself a task of all-round development for the islanders while keeping ecological concern and tribal issue in the fore.
