In fact a workshop of the field officials of AAJVS and Group of Experts was conducted during October'2012 at Port Blair to identify the above topics.</p> <p>The Project study has been carried out by the Experts viz. Prof. Vishvajit Pandya, Shri Manish Chandi, Director (TW), Officers of AAJVS with thrust on ethnographic observation and anthropological understanding of the concerns relating to livelihood security of Jarawas, their social organization, forms of education and learning and health & nutrition well being. The research team submitted its findings entitled "Jarawa movements in relation to time and space" to the Administration.</p> <p>The next phase of work in the Jarawa reserve territory will be carried out through the Hot Spots. The process of setting up of Hot Spots at the following places viz Bada Balu, Jhao Kona, Tirur and Potatang in South Andaman and Phooltala, Lewis Inlet and Bluff Island in Middle and North Andaman is being taken, and once the structure for Hot Spots at the respective places come up and become operational the second phase of work on the Jarawa study including empowerment will begin.</p>
3	Item No. 40 Amendment of the A & N Islands (PAT) Regulation of 1956.	The Ministry of Law and Justice notified on 2.7.2012, the A & N Islands (Protection of Aboriginal Tribes) Amendment Regulation, 2012 and the same has been brought into force w.e.f 9.7.2012. The said Regulation defines the terms like Buffer Zone, commercial/tourist establishments etc, apart from empowering the A & N Administration to notify buffer zone from time to time, strict penal provisions have also been incorporated to deter violators of the regulation. The same has been uploaded in the Administration's website.
4.	Item No. 40 Transfer of Committed liabilities from Plan to Non-Plan.	The proposal of 21 posts in Plan Schemes to Non-Plan been sent to the Administration. The Committed liability shall come to Rs. 86.00 lakhs and the same has been projected in the Budget Estimate of 2013-2014.
