	<p><b>31.</b> (1) Subject to the rules made under this Regulation, a Village Council may organize a Village Volunteer Force consisting of able bodied males residing in the village who are between the ages of 21 and 40 years and who are willing to join the force and place such force under the command of a suitable person.</p>	Village volunteer force
