(1) Every Island Council shall consist of such number of seats as the Administrator may, by notification, determine.</p> <p>(2) The Chief Captain of each Island Council shall be elected through direct election by the registered voters of all Village General Bodies of that Island Council constituted under section 3 of this regulation. All the First Captains of each village in an Island shall elect from amongst themselves the Vice Chief Captain of the Island Council.
