(1) If in the opinion of the Administrator, a Village Council-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) exceeds or abuses its powers; or (b) is incompetent to perform or makes willful and persistent default in performance of the duties imposed on it by or under this Regulation or any other law for the time being in force; or (c) fails to levy the taxes leviable under this Regulation; or (d) persistently disobeys the order of the Deputy Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner made under sub-section (2) of section 47, the Administrator may, by order published in the Official Gazette dissolve the Village Council. <p>(2) No order under sub-section (1) shall be passed without giving to the Village Council a reasonable opportunity to render an explanation.</p> <p>(3) If a Village Council is dissolved under sub-section (1) the following consequence shall ensue, namely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) all the members of the Village Council shall from the date specified in the order, cease to be members; (b) all powers and duties of the Village Council shall during the period of dissolution of the Village Council, be exercised and performed by such person or persons, appointed by the Administrator in this behalf; <p>(4) An election to constitute a Village Council shall be completed before the expiry of a period of six months from the date of its dissolution.</p>	<p>Dissolution of Village Council</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Mr. ... in G.O.</i></p>
