	57. If any question arises whether a person has become subject to any disqualification referred to in section 4, section 7 or section 56 it shall be referred to the Deputy Commissioner, for decision.	Decision on question as to disqualify-cation.
	Provided that before giving any decision on any such question, the Deputy Commissioner shall obtain the opinion of the Election Commission and shall act in accordance with such opinion.

(1) On the constitution of an Island Council for the first time under this regulation or on the expiry of the term of an Island Council or on its re-constitution the Deputy Commissioner shall cause a meeting to be convened under the Chairmanship of Assistant Commissioner for the election of the Vice Chief Captain from amongst the members of the Island Council.	
	(2) The election shall be conducted under the direct superintendence of the Assistant Commissioner concerned wherein the meeting shall be presided over by the Chief Captain of the Island Council who shall not have the right to vote.	
	(3) No business other than the election of the Vice Chief Captain shall be transacted at such meeting.	
	(4) In case of equality of votes, the result of the election shall be decided by draw of lots by the Assistant Commissioner in such manner as he may determine.
