	<p><b>88.</b> (1) If, in the opinion of the Administrator, an Island Council -</p> <p>(a) exceeds or abuses its powers; or</p> <p>(b) is incompetent to perform, or makes willful and persistent default in the performance of the duties imposed on it by or under this Regulation or any other law for the time being in force; or</p> <p>(c) fails to levy the taxes leviable under this Regulation; or</p> <p>(d) persistently disobeys the order of the Deputy Commissioner made under sub-section (2) of section 86, the Administrator may, by order published in the Official Gazette, dissolve the Island Council and direct that it shall be re-constituted in the manner provided in this Regulation.</p> <p>(2) No order under sub-section (1) shall be passed without giving the Island Council a reasonable opportunity to render an explanation.</p> <p>(3) If an Island Council is dissolved under sub-section (1) the following consequences shall ensue, namely: -</p> <p>(a) all the members of the Island Council shall, from the date specified in the order, cease to be members;</p> <p>(b) all powers and duties of the Island Council shall, during the period of dissolution of the Island Council, be exercised and performed by such person or persons as the Administrator may appoint in this behalf;</p> <p>(c) the committees of the Island Council shall be deemed to have been dissolved and all the members of the committees shall vacate office from such date.</p>	Dissolution of Island Council
