(i) any objection which appears to the Deputy Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner to exist relating to the doing of anything which is about to be done or being done by such Village Council, and to make written reply to the Deputy Commissioner / Assistant Commissioner as the case may be, within the time specified by the Deputy Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner, stating its reasons for not desisting from doing it.

(ii) any information which the Deputy Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner is able to furnish and which appears to the Deputy Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner to necessitate the doing of a certain thing by the Village Council, and to make written reply to the Deputy Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner, as the case may be, time specified by the Deputy within the Commissioner or the Assistant Commissioner, stating its reasons for desisting from doing such things.

46. If, at any time, it appears to the Deputy Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner that a Village Council has made willful and persistent default in the performance of any duty imposed on it by this Regulation, he may, by order in writing, fix a period for the performance of that duty:

Default in performance of the duty by Village Council.

Provided that where the duty is not performed within the period so fixed, the Deputy Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner may appoint any person to perform it, and direct that the expenses for the performance of such duty shall be paid by the defaulting Village Council within such period as the Deputy Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner may think fit.

Suspension of execution of order on resolution of Village Council.

47. (1) If, in the opinion of the Deputy Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner, the execution of any order or resolution of a Village Council or the doing of anything which is about to be done or is being done by or on behalf of a Village Council is causing or is likely to cause injury or annoyance to the public or to lead to a breach of the peace or is unlawful, he may, by order in writing, suspend the execution or prohibit the doing thereof.
