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86. (1) If, in the opinion of the Deputy Commissioner, the execution of any order or resolution of an Island Council or the doing of anything which is about to be done or is being done by or on behalf of an Island Council is causing or likely to cause injury or annoyance to the public or to lead to breach of the peace or is unlawful, he may, by order in writing, suspend the execution or prohibit the doing thereof.

Suspension of execution of order or resolution of Island Council.

- (2) When the Deputy Commissioner makes an order under sub-section (1), he shall forthwith send to the Island Council affected thereby a copy of the order together with a statement of the reasons for making it.
- (3) The Deputy Commissioner shall forthwith submit to the Secretary Tribal Welfare of the Union Territory a report of the circumstances in which the order was made under this section and the Secretary Tribal Welfare of the Union Territory may, after giving notice to the Island Council and making such inquiry as he deems fit, rescind, modify or confirm the order.
- **87.** (1) Every member of an Island Council shall be personally liable for the loss, wastage or misapplication of any money or other property of the Island Council to which he has been a party or which has been caused or facilitated by his misconduct or willful neglect of his duty as a member amounting to fraud.

Liability of members for loss, wastage or misapplication.

(2) If after giving the member concerned a reasonable opportunity for showing cause to the contrary, the Deputy Commissioner is satisfied that the loss, wastage or misapplication of any money or other property of the Island Council is a direct consequence of misconduct or willful neglect on his part, he shall by order in writing, direct such member to pay to the Island Council before a fixed date, the amount required to reimburse it for such loss, wastage or misapplication:

Provided that no such order shall be made for bonafide or technical irregularities or mistakes of a member.

(3) If the amount is not so paid, the Deputy Commissioner shall recover it in such manner as may be prescribed, and credit it to the Island Council Fund.
