

- (f) has been ordered to give security for good behaviour under section 109 or 110 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973; or
 - (g) has been convicted by a criminal Court of any offence involving violence or moral turpitude and sentenced to imprisonment for not less than three months and a period of five year have not elapsed since his release; or
 - (h) has not attained age of 21 years; or
 - (i) is of unsound mind and has been so declared by a competent court; or
 - (j) has been declared by a competent court as an insolvent; or
 - (k) has been disqualified under any law relating to election for the time being in force for adopting corrupt practice or for commission of an election offence during the period of such disqualification; or
 - (j) subject to clause (b) is so disqualified by or under any law for the time being in force for the purposes of election to the House of people.
95. If any question arises as to whether a person has become subject to any disqualification referred to in section 4, section 7 or section 94 it shall be referred to the Chief Secretary of the Union Territory for decision and his decision thereon shall be final:

Provided that before giving any decision on any such question, the Chief Secretary shall obtain the opinion of the Election Commission and shall act according to such opinion,

96. (i) On the constitution of the District Council for the first time under this Regulation or on the expiry of the term of the District Council or on its reconstitution, a meeting shall be called on a date fixed by the Deputy commissioner for the election of the Chief Councillor and the Deputy Chief Councillor.
- (ii) The Deputy Commissioner shall, preside at such meeting but not have the right to vote.
- (iii) No business other than the election of the Chief Councillor and the Deputy Chief Councillor shall be transacted at such meeting.
- (iv) In case of equality of votes, the result of the election shall be decided by lots drawn in the presence of the Deputy Commissioner in such manner as he may determine.
- (v) The Chief Councillor and the Deputy Chief Councillor of the District Council shall be elected by, and from amongst its elected members in the first week of April every year for the duration of that financial year.
- (vi) The Office of the Chief Councillor for the first and third year of the District Council shall be reserved for women.
