

THE THIRD SCHEDULE

[See section 70 (1)]

MATTERS IN RESTECT OF WHICH A ISLAND COUNCIL WILL HAVE AUTHERITY SO AS TO ENABLE IT TO FUNCTION AS AN INSTITUTION OF SELF GOVERNMENT.

- 1. In the sphere of sanitation and health
 - (a) controlling epidemics and expansion and maintenance of health services;
 - (b) family planning;
 - (c) providing facilities for pure drinking water.
 - (d) maintenance and supervision of drugs, dispensaries, pharmacies, maternity homes and primary health centres;
 - (e) cultivating opinion on following methods for the preservation of health and sanitation
 - (i) nourishment;
 - (ii) maternity and child welfare;
 - (iii) control and eradication of contagious disease;
- (f) providing for help and protection to the people against epidemic.
- 2. In the sphere or communication
 - (a) Construction and maintenance of village link roads;
 - (b) providing necessary assistance for construction and maintenance of village approach road.
- 3. in the sphere of education and culture
 - (a) recruitment of staff for Adult Education, Non-formal Education, Early childhood care and education programmes;
 - (b) appointment of staff in schools from approved panels;
 - (c) transfer of teachers within their jurisdiction subject to guidelines;
 - (d) academic supervision of all institutions upto upper primary levels;
 - (e) delegation of powers of supervision over composite upper primary schools to the Village Council for purposes of continuity;
 - (f) preparation of budget and sanction of plan and expenditure from the Island Council Education Budget;
 - (g) disbursement of funds to aided institutions under supervisions of District Council;
 - (h) levying of development fees and other fees to raise resources;
 - (i) raising of public contribution and donations.
