

I had occasion to interact with members of the Tribal Council Chukchucha of Car Nicobar in the Andaman & Nicobar Islands on 17.3.2007 during my recent tour to the Union Territory. The members of the Tribal Council explained at length the need for acceptance of the draft regulations of the Tribal Council Act, 1996. Shri Cephaus Jack, Dy. Vice Chief of the Tribal Council of Car Nicobar, explained that the basic structure of Nicobarese family and social life revolved around the "Tuhet" system. The traditional Tuhet or modified joint family system comprises anywhere between 45 to 350 members wherein the headman or captain is nominated or selected.

The Tribal Council also felt that elections be held on a non-political basis incorporating the Tuhet system. Only recently, elections through secret ballots has been initiated. Traditionally, Tuhet heads are elected from the first, second and third captains of the 15 villages of Nicobaris in Car Nicobar Islands, Nancowry and Little Nicobar. Thus elections are conducted by secret ballots of 3 captains from the 5 nominated leaders of the Tuhets heads.

The Nicobaris stressed the need for their own regulations for self-governance in 1996 and had these reexamined and reforwarded again in 2003. They are reportedly pending with the Government for legal status. I would request that this matter be kindly expedited.
