

- substantive or in default of payment of fine, shall be imposed by a Village Judicial Council.
- 73. Instead of passing any sentence, a Village Judicial Council may discharge after due admonition, a youthful offender who, in the opinion of such village judicial council, is, at the time of conviction for the offence under the age of sixteen years.
- 74. In imposing any fine under section 72, a Village Judicial Council may direct that the whole or any portion of the fine recovered shall he applied -
 - (a) towards defraying the expenses actually incurred in the case by the complainant; or
 - (b) in giving compensation to a person for any material loss or damage caused to him by reason of the commission of the offence.
- 75. A Village Judicial Council may, if it is satisfied after enquiry that a case brought before it, is false, frivolous or vexatious, order the complainant to pay the accused such compensation not exceeding rupees fifty as it thinks fit.
- 76.(1) Whenever the Village Judicial Councilor has reason to apprehend that any person within the jurisdiction of a village judicial council is likely to commit a breach of peace or disturb the public tranquility, he may, by notice in writing, require such person to show cause why he should not be ordered to execute a bond with or without sureties for an amount not exceeding rupees one hundred for keeping peace for a period not exceeding fifteen days and shall, after issue of such notice, refer the matter to the Village Judicial Council.
