On the issue of Sentinelese, Hon'ble Lt. Governor asked Director ANTRI to prepare necessary questionnaire, for the team to circumnavigate the North Sentinel Island which should be circulated well in advance for getting their inputs and having their feedback on their return. He further suggested that the suggestions made by Shri. Hrushikesh Panda, the then Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs for signing up MoU with the National Remote Sensing Institute Hyderabad for seeking data/information based on remote sensing on the pattern of movement of the Sentinelese in the island, through ANTRI be also given a final shape.

F) Strengthening of AAJVS :-

- i) Hon'ble Lt. Governor asked Secretary (TW) to re-assess the requirement of staff of AAJVS for implementation of development programmes and submit the proposal along with its financial implication for his consideration.
- ii) The Forest/Police Department was asked to provide a suitable sea-worthy boat to AAJVS with a crew for patrolling and reaching out welfare measures in the western coast of Jarawa Reserve.
- iii) He further desired that one Tribal Welfare Officer be made responsible and accountable implementation of policies and development programmes for each primitive tribe and Director ANTRI shall interact with these Officers once a month and submit a brief note to the Hon'ble Lt. Governor for his perusal every quarter.

The House after detailed deliberations, review of expenditure incurred by AAJVS during the year 2013-14, accepted the Annual Plan for the year 2015-16.

(A) Mission/Vision document of AAJVS : On the issue of AAJVS Vision document 2014, the Hon'ble Lt. Governor desired that all the members of the General Body may carefully go through the document and submit their comments/suggestions to Director, ANTRI who shall, on receipt of the same, put up a the proposal for seeking approval of the Competent Authority.

(B) Grains for gains among Aungs at Anaholey Chaddas.

Prof. Vishwajit Pandya, made a power point presentation on education of the Jarawa through Anaholey Chaddas (Hot Spots). He said that the project Ang Katha was commenced from 22 October 2014 at Potatang which had evoked tremendous enthusiasm amongst the Jarawa children including their parents. He also gave a detailed account as to how the curriculum was conceived and devised including the outcome of the project undertaking.

The Hon'ble Lt Governor placed on record his appreciation on the good efforts made by AAJVS staff under the expert guidance of Prof. Vishwajit Pandya in educating the Jarawa children through Ang Katha and desired that the gains made be further consolidated.
