

- (iii) Clandestine supply of liquor to Jarawas by non - tribals
  - (iv) Severe vulnerability of the women splinter group of Tirur region for sexual exploitation by non - tribals.
  - (v) Miscegenation due to illicit affairs of non - tribal men with Jarawa women
  - (vi) Criminal activities leading to infanticide of mulatto
  - (vii) Criminal laws and the Jarawas
  - (viii) Serious health hazard for Jarawas due to imminent STD /AIDS.
- (4) It was categorically explained that the wise option available would be to make a strong, effective and foolproof joint patrolling by AAJVS, Police and Forest to prevent unauthorized entry of non-tribals into Jarawa reserve area and also unwarranted straying of Jarawas into non-tribal areas. Director (ANTRI) further stressed the need for making A & N islands (PAT) Regulation, 1956 more stringent through amendment.
- (5) Secretary (TW) mentioned about the reinforcement required for the effective joint patrolling for the protection of the Jarawas that being proposed for placing before the forthcoming meeting of Executive Council of AAJVS.
- (6) After deliberation, it was decided to intensify the existing joint patrolling for which a dedicated Police contingent headed by a Sub-Inspector shall be pressed into service quickly. The Police will crack down on poachers and on the repeat offenders.
- (7) Tribal Welfare Department will convene a meeting of Public Prosecutor quickly in the chamber of Chief Secretary which will be attended by Director General of Police and others to discuss about
