At the outset the Commissioner (Transport) welcomed the members.

During the course of discussion, it was observed that the Police Department has been allowing the movement of Traffic in convoys and the first convoy consists of 60-70 vehicles which is regulated by only 4-5 Police personnel. This not only results in improper monitoring of such a large number of vehicles in the convoy but it has also become difficult for the shipping department to take vehicles to the other side of creek. On this aspect Secretary (Tribal Welfare) and Director (Shipping Services) suggested that long destination bound vehicles and goods carriage vehicles carrying essential supplies should be allowed in the first convoy. Each convoy should have less than 30 vehicles by maintaining a gap of at least half an hour between two convoys so that the pressure of vehicles at the jetty in Ferry Service could be handled in an efficient and smooth manner. Tourist vehicles may be allowed in separate and small convoys to make the
