will be better if these vehicles are permitted in the first convoy of the day starting from South Andaman. The vehicles going upto Baratang should than be allowed in the subsequent convoys. Also there must be the be restriction on number of vehicles in these convoys for better traffic movement and regulation of their activities while in transit through Jarawa Reserve. We will be reversed

We may also considering provided bigger/buses to have (C) carry visitors to Baratang Caves etc with window covered with dark film/screen so that visibility reduces to bore minimum from both inside and outside. These can be partition between the driver's chamber and passenger portion, so that passengers can not see through the glass/windshield in the These alternative arrangement will reduce front. number of vehicles moving on ATR considerably and at the same time reduce possibilities of eye or other contact with Jarawas as well. Such buses can be given the permit to return back the same day, thereby the unnecessary strain of crossing of a large number of vehicles at Middle Strait Jetty will be removed. Normally 200-300 or some days move visitors go to see the caves and this can be easily handled by 6-7 buses in place of 30-40 tourist vehicles/S.U.Vs plying presently both ways. Once alternate sea route is developed in future, the pressure of vehicles on ATR can be further reduced.
