CIRCULAR


With a view to protect the interest of the aboriginal Jarawa tribe inhabiting South and Middle Andaman Islands and in supersession of earlier circular of even number dated 7.5.2009, it has been decided that entry of vehicles of all kind into the Jarawa Tribal Reserve be regulated by the Police.

Two wheelers and three wheelers may not be permitted in order to reduce the possibility of interaction with the Jarawas. Only light vehicles, trucks and buses may be permitted. Convoys may be allowed beyond Jirkatang No.II to Middle Strait and vice-versa under appropriate Police escort at the following timings only:

	From Jirkatang	From Middle Strait
First convoy	0600 hrs	0630 hrs
Second convoy	0900 hrs	0930 hrs
Third convoy	1200 hrs	1230 hrs
Fourth convoy	1430 hrs	1500 hrs


Speed limit of 40 Kms per hour may be observed by the convoys. Stopping en-route should be avoided in order to avoid interaction with Jarawas. Overtaking should be prohibited.
